Big focus on numeracy and literacy

PD of staff to improve their ability to work with kids on reading, writing, speaking and comprehension

STEM - working with Regional Office ot increase staffing

Academic , sporting, the art- is what primary school parents are looking for – CSS wants to hear from us.

AFL will be a curriculum subject for grade 7s and 8s – already attracting kids from other schools

SDE is a separate entity that shares a campus with CSC

Looking at how to revitalise the reputation of the school eg. Improve the product, should they change the name?

400 eligible students in catchment, 24% go to private, 26% go to other State schools, \sim 22% go to CSC with some students some from out of catchment.

400 students enrolled, capacity is 800

Extension for top end students is a class streamed and given higher level work.

QME academy is going to be offered to some of the extension students, Griffith uni – STEM Camp, Distant ed opportunities,

STEAM is the next academy to be introduced after they succeed at running the AFL academy. But want to do AFL well first.

BSS response to this is how can we assist to ensure the success of the CSC. Can we lobby local
