






Donation of goods and services for prizes










Would you support parents making a financial donation to the P&C if they are unable to volunteer to staff the events?

Equipping classes with Air Conditioning System. If you turn admin's office air con off for just an hour at noon everyday, you would thoroughly understand how poor little kids attend at classes.

Sporting programs. Next budget is disproportionately in favour of music. Buranda SS strongly supports the current extra-curricular offerings because they are so limited. I recommend a multi-sport program or girls soccer skills. The 2nd recommendation is made because the boys dominate the soccer space at lunch time and if the girls were given the skills they may have the confidence to participate. I can help to facilitate my recommendations.

Tuck shop should be run on daily basis.

I strongly recommend tuck shop should be every day.

1) Permanent in-school language teachers provided free from Prep onward so any family can choose to opt in; 2) Fund Education QLD cultural liaison staff to regularly visit Buranda and assist teachers to deliver indigenous content; 3) Natural landscaping that includes large shade trees for the children to play under as well as rest under plus a range of textures like big stacked boulders and logs for climbing & playing on and around. 
